1.0 Policy

All children who reside with their parents in the City of Detroit, or meet other residency requirements are entitled to a free education in the Detroit public school system as soon as they reach legal entrance age. The ages of eligibility for free public school education and services for handicapped students extends from birth to age 19.

For admission to the Detroit public schools for the first time, children must present all of the following:

1. A birth certificate or other evidence of age.
2. A record of immunizations, with such exceptions as permitted by law.
3. Upon request, evidence of residency.

Students enrolling from other schools in Michigan or in other states will provide such information as necessary for obtaining their past school records. Out-of-state health records will be evaluated for evidence of meeting Michigan immunization requirements.
